Rev. Bro. Director's Message

ONCE again the curtain comes down on yet another year in our school career. There are many events that make 1965 memorable for us Michaelians — The combined Mass at the year's commencement, the noise and bustle of the Fun Fair, the announcement of the L.C.E. and Cambridge Results, the successful production of the 'Magic Key', the Interact Talenteime Night, the publication of Explorer IV, our success in athletics, our Speech Day and Prize Giving Ceremony, our stage rendering of the 'Winslow Boy', the Cambridge dinners, the Annual Mass on the eve of the final Examination, and the examinations themselves. Nevertheless for the theme of this message I should like to select, rather oddly perhaps, not one that has a Michaelian flavour but one that affected the international scene — the passing of Sir Winston Churchill.

For many, the name of Sir Winston Churchill is almost legend. He leaves behind a heritage of hope. His war time speeches and addresses still infuse people with enthusiasm and determination. We admire the man for his dogged tenacity of purpose, his inspiring courage, his noble sense of duty, his never failing humour and optimism and his sincere love for his country.

We remember him as the man, who when assuming office as Prime Minister promised his countrymen, "blood, toil, tears and sweat". We recall the stirring way in which he spurred his men on against the threat of immediate invasion. "We shall not flag nor fail, We shall go on to the end, We shall never surrender". We hear once again his invitation to his people to consider themselves as the makers of history. We recall how he urged them to brace themselves to their duties and so bear themselves that, if the British Empire and its Commonwealth last for a 1,000 years, men will still say "This was their finest hour".

We call to mind the manner in which he rallied people in words that sound Biblical in origin, "Arm yourselves and be ye men of valour and be in readiness for the conflict".

His demands on his countrymen were severe, but he counted on the moral fibre of all men of good will. He brought them through hard days on to victory, and yet when disappointment overtook him in the 1945 elections, he relinquished power without a murmur, and in his farewell message he thanked all for the unflinching and unswerving support they had given him during his days as Prime Minister.


It is no wonder then that England to a man mourned his passing most sincerely and gave him the honours reserved for royalty.

Determination, a sense of duty, service to our fellowmen and trust in God's Providence — the qualities of character we admire in Churchill, are traits we too should endeavour to cultivate to improve our personality. Confronted by the choice between right and wrong, we should unhesitatingly and spontaneously choose the right, regardless of consequences. True to our Michaelian motto — "Who is like to God?", We should give the first place in our lives to God, at the same time making devotion to duty our guiding light.

Acting in this manner we will be making a personal and practical application of Churchill's urgent appeal to his countrymen some twenty-three years ago.

"Withhold no sacrifice, grudge no toil, seek no sordid gain, fear no foe, all will be well".

The message echoing down through the years carries both a plea and an assurance. Its realisation in our lives depends entirely on our own determination and effort aided by God's grace.

Rev. Bro. Director's Address on Speech Day

A famous educationalist F. H. Drinkwater once said that he took great delight in quoting from a newspaper cutting when addressing a group of men and women who were interested in the education of the young. The cutting ran as follows: "Sir, A little common sense in education would not be out of place. Children are not really born merely to provide teachers with jobs.

Pale and pinched faces, shoddy clothes and defective footwear mean that money should be spent on food, clothes and boots, not on teaching rubbish that the children will have to forget later.

There are too many buildings where children sit in damp clothes and wet shoes in bad weather, and pass colds and diseases on to one another".

Evidently the writer of the article was not referring to a country such as ours, but it is good for us in the changing times that prevail, to assess what we are doing for the children confided by the parents, to us who claim to be educators.

Today's ceremony is the simple one which goes by the usual unprepossessing dual title of Speech Day & Prize-Giving Ceremony. The literary part of it, provides a head master with a platform whereby he can show others in a modest way, what his staff have been laboursomely performing in the controlled quiet of classroom and laboratory, the confines of a so called gymnasium and the wide open spaces of a cramped playing field. This part of the ceremony is very often a drab recital of facts and figures, if not of fancy. The other part of the ceremony is more interesting for students, and heart raising for the parents — this is the reception of prizes for work undertaken, completed and crowned with success.

May I now crave your indulgence for the recital of facts and figures. We have an enrolment that is quite large:

Activities: With the modern emphasis on cultivating every side of the student, we offer our pupils a choice of various extra curricular activities.

Our Cadet Corps, under the command of Capt. Choo Joo Keat, and Lieutenants Oh Teik Toh and Albert Teh and Louis Rodriguez and Aw Teik Swee has a strength of two official platoons.

The St. John Ambulance Brigade has a very strong membership of 150. The officers, Rev. Brother Lawrence, Mr. Chen Yong Fook, Mr. Yuen Sze Tuen, Mr. Yeap Poay Chong have made use of the valuable services of the

under-officers who have been mainly responsible for the training of the Brigade members.

The members have had a very encouraging year. They won four of the trophies for the Inter-Division Competition held at State Level. The best cadet as well as the runner-up were Michaelians, Goh Eng Hoe and Fok Poon Yee respectively. The Division represented the State at the Pan-Malaysian Competition held in K. L. in August and won 14 trophies there as well.

It is very gratifying to note that the Jubilee year of the St. John Ambulance Brigade in Perak which started at St. Michael's, should be singularly marked by our achievements in Ambulance work.

Thanks in large measure go to the officers and under officers, among whom special mention should be made of Pathmanathan, an old boy, who trains the members gratis.

Scouting: The scouts were victorious in the Navaratnam Competition. They have been of great help at all our public functions. The scouting Movement is synonymous with that of Service.

We have 5 Pengakap Raja this year. The enrolment is 200 scouts and 100 cubs. However there is always a danger of a lack of enthusiasm among the older members and we should endeavour to maintain our scouting activities at a high level.

Judo: The Michaelian Judo Club has a very large number of interested members from Forms I to VI. The Patron of our club is Dr. Yan Poh Lok. Our Judo Club members have competed in Inter-Club Meets and have acquitted themselves very well. Mr. Oh Teik Toh, Mr. Chan Soo Khean, Mr. Chun Weng Kai and Mr. Yau Yet Sau are most enthusiastic. Mr. Choy Wai Kong and Mr. Khoo Hock Seng have given our boys very valuable assistance. We have 5 Black Belts.

The Chinese Art of Self Defence has a good membership. The students, are under Mr. Chan Soo Khean and Mr. Chun Weng Kai.

These club activities are entered into with great eagerness by the students concerned. However we must never fail to realise that constant interest must be maintained lest some totter, collapse and fade away.

Our Fencing Club needs a good deal more vitality. We lack a Fencing Instructor.

Sports: Our students are given the chance to play the games that appeal to any normal pupil. This year we did well in Soccer, Cricket, Tennis, Rugby and Badminton. Our swimmers have kept up the tradition and have done well in Inter School Meets. Two of our pupils were chosen to represent the State in the Malaysian Swimming Carnival. Ng Whai Khim and Lim Cho Tiau represented Malaysia in International Meets.

In athletics our school Relay Team, thanks to the coaching of Mr. Poon Mun Onn and the co-operation of the boys did extremely well.

We won in 17 out of 18 outings. It has been a Record Year for us in the field of athletics.

Societies: In addition to the above activities we have societies to cater for the academic and moral well-being of our students—The Science Society, the Literary & Historical Society, the Arts Society, the National Language Society, the Legion of Mary, the Y.C.S. and the Interact Club. The last named group organised a Talantime Show to raise funds for the school. They were most successful.

The Dramatic Society and the Orchestra were responsible, under the charge of Rev. Brother Vincent, for the production of the Magic Key, an operetta which was very much appreciated by all. The students of Forms 4 and 6 are staging the play: 'The Winslow Boy' early next month. The play is being produced by Rev. Brother Casimir. You are cordially invited. Here we would like to record our thanks to Mrs. Chan Hon Yew, and the students of the Art Club for painting the drop scenes for the operetta and the play.

Our orchestra also performed at the premiere of the film, 'The Lilies of the Field', in aid of Our Lady's Hospital. They also played in aid of the Ipoh Library.

The School Military Band under Rev. Brother Alexander has given much service. The boys have provided a noteworthy sound of music at public functions to the enjoyment of all. Mr. Kong, our instructor, can be rightly proud of these boys.

The School Corps of Drums under Mr. Tony Teh is making a come-back.

Having given you a brief, though rambling, account of the activities of the school, kindly let us lay before you our plans for the future.

We told you time and again that we would like to see new Science Laboratories, a spacious well stocked library, and a suitable canteen. We are happy to say that plans for the proposed building have been drawn. They are to be forwarded for approval very shortly. Nevertheless to pass from the blue print stage to the concrete reality that you and I are anxious to see, we have to overcome some difficulties. The main obstacle to the realisation of our plans is the lack of funds. We have to hold out our begging bowls to you good folks and the public of Ipoh because you seem to be our only hope in our quest of funds.

We feel confident that Dame Fortune will smile more benignly and our luck will take a turn for the better when the question of allocation of building grants arises. Dame Fortune has a very powerful ally, and we have a most sympathetic C.E.O. who will most certainly put in a good word for us with the powers that hold the Government purse strings, and help us unravel our knotty financial problems.

We are also anxious to have an extra Sixth Form Class here at St. Michael's Institution. Nowadays we notice a healthy trend among students to continue their studies at Higher School Level. We shall be only too happy to help out these students, if permission to start an extra Sixth Form Class can be obtained. The Chairman and Board of Governors have expres-

sed the earnest wish that this be established here, and our C.E.O., Mr. J.E.B. Ambrose, has given our aspirations his whole-hearted support. It is but fitting that St. Michael's like the other 6th Form Schools in Ipoh should be two-streamed as far as Sixth Form classes go.

As I have already stated our C.E.O. has always lent a sympathetic ear to our requests and I feel confident that his support and recommendation will ultimately secure us this much needed addition.

It is on an occasion such as this that we would like to thank all who have assisted us in one way or another in making St. Michael's what it is. We thank our C.E.O. Mr. J. E. B. Ambrose and his team of officers for the assistance they have given. We owe a debt of gratitude to our devoted and conscientious chairman, Dr. M. E. Tiruchelvam, and his board of Governors and Managers. Today, St. Michael's Day, is a fitting one to pay tribute to our devoted Chairman whose patron happens to be St. Michael. We are grateful to our benefactors and well-wishers for the monetary help they have given us. A vote of thanks to Dr. Lip Seng Chiew, the Perak Turf Club and the Lasallian Association for scholarships given our pupils. A special word of thanks to our devoted Parish Priest Rev. Fr. J. Ciatti and our other priests as well. They join the ranks of devoted priests who have given to St. Michael's spontaneous and self-sacrificing service.

The good people of Ipoh have been very helpful to us. Two years ago the Lee Kwee Foh Estate Ltd. gave us an excellent property on which stands a section of our Primary Building. This year in July we were very fortunate to receive a generous donation of a site for a Lower Secondary School from the Directors of the Ipoh Gardens Ltd. This gift has received the blessing of the C.E.O. who is anxious to ease congestion in the town areas. On behalf of Rev. Brother Visitor Michael, I wish to thank the Directors of the Ipoh Gardens Ltd. for their generous act of philanthropy which will benefit the student population of Ipoh.

Ladies and Gentlemen you know full well that a teacher's task is a serious one. We who have the charge of children realise fully well the responsibility entrusted to us.

Education to be complete should be both a two-way and threefold process. Two-way in that both parents and teachers should see to the happy coordination of home and classroom activities. If children are given a carte blanche permission to do anything they like, the task of teachers who insist on discipline and serious work is rendered all the more difficult. Education should also be threefold — we need to develop the body, mind and soul. Here in Malaysia today we are blessed with material prosperity. Our students are better fed, stronger limbed and more properly clothed by comparison with their fellow students of other countries in South East Asia. Our standard of education is high. Our schools and colleges and University can hold their own against many institutions of learning. The physical and intellectual growth of our students is very carefully attended to. Nevertheless the entire person must be educated and in our anxiety to improve the body and mind we may neglect the proper development of the spiritual side of our students. The responsibility is a real one and must not be shirked.

One way of promoting this development is to provide our students with lessons which inculcate principles of morality. We also afford them a chance to attend an annual retreat during vacation time. How far we have succeeded in this direction, only God and the individual person can gauge. Time only will tell, when we lay down our tools at the Master's bidding. In this connection my thoughts are better expressed by the poet Tennyson.

"Time driveth onward fast
And in a little while our lips are dumb.
Let us alone, what is it that will last?
All things are taken from us and become
Portions and parcels of the Dreadful past".

What is it that will last? A good life of course.
And his exhortation echoes well —

the Quis Vt Deus of our School Motto.

"Live pure, speak true,
Right wrong, Follow the King
Else wherefore born.

Ladies and gentlemen I have led you a tedious and somewhat boring jogtrot down through the corridors of time of the Michaelian School Year 1964/1965. You have been most excellent, appreciative and silent companions in this afternoon's version of follow the leader. For this we owe you our thanks.


21st May: Annual retreat from Form IV boys begins.






9th - 11th August: Legionaries under Messrs. Clement Manikam, Thomas Choo, and Michael Foong holiday in Penang.



15th November: H. S. C. and S. C. examinations begin.





It is fitting therefore that it should go to Lee Kah Chee this year in view of the many-sided service he has rendered to the school as Head-Prefect, Drum Major in the Military Band, member of the school orchestra, House Captain for swimming, and vice-president of the Literary and Historical Society, to mention some of his activities. His interests are varied, and his talents many. He has distinguished himself as an actor in school plays and operettas. He has frequently represented

the school in debates, he was awarded the bronze-medallion for life-saving and the Instructor's Certificate, and he holds the rank of commissioned officer in the St. John Ambulance Brigade.

Besides merely listing his range of achievements, it is important too to emphasize his initiative and sense of responsibility. These were his special characteristics as Head-Prefect and as Drum-Major in the Military Band. And mention should be made of the fact that through all his activities, whether it was attending to matters of discipline within the prefectorial board, taking part in a stage production, organising important functions, etc., he was still able to give due attention to his studies.

We trust his worthy example will be an inspiration to all would-be leaders in our midst.
