
Membership this year has risen to 62 and includes students from form two to form six. A number of Malay girls joined the group this year; this has given us all a measure of special

Folk Dancing Society






runner-up in the highest individual award test. We wish to thank Mr. Cheong Yip Choon a former Michaelian now in Taiping for much appreciated assistance.

the services of Mr. Choo Kwong Ngee, a former Penang player, as our coach. Practices became more frequent and there was noticeable improvement.







The girls, after some bumps and bruises, managed to field a reasonably strong side for the David shield. They drew with ASI but un-


luckily lost to ACS by one goal. It is hoped that more girls will take to hockey in future seasons.




The four L's represented Malaysia at the first Asian age group swimming championship




Netball





The club held the school tournament in June. It was especially heartening to receive so many entries for the boys section. The results of the tournament were as follows:



Primary School I

STAFF & ENROLMENT:

Primary School I has 29 classes in 1970 with a total enrolment 1429 pupils at the beginning of the year. The pupils are under the charge of the headmaster, Mr. Lim Guan Choe, assisted by 34 qualified teachers and two clerks.

485 pupils were registered for the Std. I classes, but we were only able to admit 250. We apologise for those who have been turned away.

246 pupils from Std. VI classes will be leaving us to join the St. Michael's Secondary School.

DISCIPLINE:

The discipline of the school is maintained by a Board composed of Prefects, appointed from the Upper Primary Classes which is under the charge of Mr. Khong Shu Ming and Mr. T. A. Dass. They are assisted by six teachers weekly. Mr. Khoo Kok Hean, the Senior Assistant assist as adviser. The Headmaster Mr. Lim Guan Choe, is the chairman.

Certificates of Commendation are awarded to Prefects who have discharged their various duties and entertained to a tea-party at the end of the year.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES:

School Assemblies are held twice a week — on Mondays and Fridays. These assemblies are to foster a spirit of pride and respect for the National Flag and National Anthem and also unity among the pupils.

At these Assemblies, the National Flag is broken, followed by the singing of the National Anthem and then a short talk on civics by the Headmaster. The Assemblies are rounded off with the singing of the School Rally.

SCHOOL TEXT-BOOKS COMMITTEE:

This Committee has been functioning for the past seven years. Members of the Committee are appointed to review books on various subjects bearing in mind the contents in conjunction with the Govt. Syllabus and their suitability for class use. Before any new books are introduced, they have to be tried out for a year side by side with the identical book used.

IMPLEMENTATION OF BAHASA MALAYSIA IN ENGLISH MEDIUM SCHOOLS

This year all subjects are taught in Bahasa Malaysia in Std. I with English as a second language. P.E., Art & Craft, Local Studies, Health Education and music are taught in

Bahasa Malaysia in Stds. 2 and 3. Geography, P.E., Health Education and Civics are taught in Bahasa Malaysia in Std. 4, and P.E., Health Science and Civics in Std. 5. The changing of the medium in the teaching of the remaining subjects into Bahasa Malaysia will be phased gradually until 1975 when all subjects will be taught in Bahasa Malaysia.

Two teachers have completed a Bahasa Malaysia Course in Kuala Lumpur organised by the Ministry of Education. Two other teachers are attending the same course during the terminal holidays, while a fifth teacher is attending the course during the third term.

LANGUAGES:

The importance of Bahasa Malaysia is constantly stressed to the pupils and they are encouraged to express themselves in this medium whenever possible.

Classes in Chinese and Tamil are conducted from Stds. III to Stds. IV for pupils whose parents wish them to take up these languages.

EXAMS & WEEKLY TESTS:

Examinations are held twice a year, once in mid-June and the other in October. During the course of the year, weekly tests are given to all pupils on various subjects. Results of all these tests are recorded in the pupils' report cards once every two weeks for the parent's or guardian's signature. Parents/Guardians are requested to sign the children's report cards in their own language, if they are unable to do so in English.

We appeal to Parents/Guardians to take a keener interest in the children's progress and to comply with the request to sign the children's report cards.

246 candidates sat for the Standard VI Standardised Examination set by the Kementerian Pelajaran Malaysia in October 1970.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION:

Muslim pupils receive instruction from their religious teachers — Inche Mohd. Ismail b. Hj. Ibrahim and Inche Mohd. Said b. Hamid Selau. They are encouraged to sit for the Koran Examination held by the Religious Department, Perak.


Catholic pupils are grouped together in their various standards and given religious instruction by Catholic Teachers. Other pupils are taught moral science or civics during the Catechism Lessons.

Rev. Bro. Philip prepares pupils for 1st Holy Communion and Mr. T.A. Dass prepares them for Confirmation.

We thank Rev. Fr. M. Thoo and Rev. Fr. Pakiam for looking after the spiritual needs of our Catholic pupils.




(g) *Children's Day*: Children's Day was held on the 2nd Oct. 1970. Teachers organised their own class parties. The School supplied free drinks and lollipops.

Primary School II

THE year under review has been a successful one for the school. A high standard in studies and participation in competitive sports and in as many games as possible have been the features of the school throughout and this year no less these objectives have been achieved. The Primary School buildings were set up originally to accommodate 25 classes, but the school is a five-stream school needing 30 classrooms and our chief difficulty is therefore one of insufficient space and the lack of a proper library room. These problems are not easy to solve as putting up additional rooms involves a five-figure sum. We are, however, directing our attention and efforts to this matter and hope something tangible and fruitful will result.

ENROLMENT

The school has at the beginning of the year a total enrolment of 1353 pupils in 28 classes

compared with 1286 pupils and 27 classes last year. There is therefore a gain of one class and 67 boys. Five classes of Std. I boys were admitted in January while 187 boys left after completing Std. VI in last November.

THE TEACHING STAFF

The number of Teachers stands at 34, 15 of whom being men and 19 women. It is gratifying to record that the incidence of absence from school among the Teaching Staff is very low, and that a Teacher keeps away from school only because he/she is literally unable to stand on his/her feet and must take a rest. Indeed there are members of the staff who come to school even though they have not fully recovered from sickness, returning to lessons after taking two days' leave when their Doctors grant 3. Again there are Teachers who refuse to go home when taken ill at school. Instead they ask for a Panadol pill to help them finish the





day. I am proud to have such dedicated Teachers and the children cannot but benefit from this laudable attitude.

THE CURRICULUM

In common with all Primary English Schools in the Country, the Teaching of all subjects in the curriculum in Bahasa Malaysia is implemented in Std. I for the first time this year. Our Teachers have the requisite qualifications to carry out this policy and apart from some minor problems at the beginning of the year, the scheme is working satisfactorily. At present, except for Mathematics and Science, all subjects are taught in Bahasa Malaysia up to Std. IV and by 1975, in all Standards, every subject will be taught in the medium of Bahasa Malaysia. In view of the importance of the National Language, more time has been allotted to this subject and the children are encouraged not only to master the written part but also the spoken.

EXAMINATIONS

For the second consecutive year the school has topped all Perak Primary English Schools in the Std. V Government Assessment Examination held last year. The Chief Education Officer himself announced this at a meeting of Heads of Primary English Schools in April this year, after the results have been analysed. This is a signal honour to the School and to the Teachers of Std. V who richly deserve high praise. The percentage of passes was 78.15.

Std. VI boys continue to take their Standardized Tests at the end of the year in common with all other children in English Primary Schools.

The school continues to hold 2 main examinations yearly, the mid-year and the final. In addition, monthly and fortnightly tests are given and Std. V pupils also sit for a trial examination before they take the official Assessment Examination.

For all pupils in the Upper Primary School, a Pass in Bahasa Malaysia is compulsory in order to pass in the whole examination. This has been the rule of the school throughout in order to emphasize the importance of the subject.

GAMES AND ATHLETICS

Our school competed in the following games under the Schools' Sports Council:

Football, Badminton, Sepak Takraw, Table Tennis, Hockey and Biddy Basketball. We were eliminated in the early rounds in most of the games but we did quite well in the Shell Traffic Games and Biddy Basketball. In the Shell Traffic Games we were placed fourth in the final. In Biddy Basketball the competing teams were divided into three groups. We emerged champions in our group but were beaten into third place in the final.

Once again we are proud of our relay team which won the championship trophies at the Ashby Road School Sports, Cator Avenue School Sports, Green Town Tamil School Sports and our School Sports. Our relay team shone again at the Ipoh District Athletic Sports at Cator Avenue School. Our relay team came out first again. Lau Mun Kong and Sandrasekaran won the first and second places in the 100 Metres and 200 Metres respectively. At the end of the second day our school emerged the overall champion school of the Ipoh District.

Our relay team represented the Ipoh District at the Central Branch Meet held at the Anderson School. Lau Mun Kong participated in the 100 Metres flat. Later he represented the Central Branch at the Perak Schools' Sports held at Sekolah Tuanku Abdul Rahman.

We are working under a handicap in the matter of training our boys for competitive games. For the first half year the school keeps afternoon sessions, finishing the day at 6.05 p.m. We are thus unable to hold training and practice sessions on weekdays. Only Saturdays are available but this is not enough to get our teams into proper shape.

CUBBING

The school has 2 cub packs, the 3rd Ipoh and the 4th Ipoh under the charge of Mr. Liao Fu Sing, Miss Anita Chan and Mr. Chua Kok Thye. We have our meetings on Saturdays beginning at 7.30 a.m. Each meeting lasts for about an hour. The first half hour is spent in the classroom where the boys are taught some star work, some songs and the boys have to copy some notes. The boys are then taken to the field where they have games.

The boys are very interested and keen in their work as evidenced by their regular attendance every Saturday.

UNIVERSAL CHILDREN'S DAY

As in previous years, the occasion was celebrated in a fitting manner by all classes. In order that the children understood its significance the Teachers explained what it meant, what its purpose was and how they could help others less fortunate than they. Emphasis was laid on playing their part in spreading goodwill, understanding and harmony in their own small way. A variety concert was held in which every class was well represented. This was followed by the children partaking of the cakes, fruits and other titbits brought to school by those who were better placed financially. This meant that those who could not afford to bring anything were given a generous treat. Needless to say, every child felt happy and satisfied, the giver and the given.

MALAY LANGUAGE SOCIETY

The Malay Language Society has entered its sixth year and is performing the very useful function of popularizing the National Language. The children meet regularly and participate in story telling, essay writing and at the end of the year a competition is held for them. A detailed account is given separately elsewhere in these pages.

PRIZE-GIVING DAY

November 13th was Prize-giving Day. On hundred and sixty-six pupils were given awards. Eighty-one received prizes for doing well in examinations. 48 for winning competitions in Essay writing, story telling organised by the Malay Language Society and 30 awards were given to Prefects.

Peter Louis was awarded the prize as Sportsboy of the year while the Relay Team was similarly honoured.

I would like to thank Rev. Bro. U. Paul, the Director of St. Michael's Secondary School for giving out the prizes.

GENERAL

The school has been in existence for eleven years and the tone and spirit of its pupils and Teachers are as fine and high as ever. Particularly noticeable are the esprit de corps among the staff and the discipline among the pupils. This has made my work considerably easier. I am therefore very thankful to the Members of the Staff and I look forward to the same co-

operation in the future. I am also grateful to the Members of the Board of Managers, particularly Dr. M. E. Tiruchelvam, the Chairman who are always ready to give their advice and

assistance; to the Chief Education Officer and the officers under him who are ever so helpful in every way and to Rev. Bro. U. Paul whose encouragement is most appreciated.

WE are delighted once again, to take up the pen and through the medium of the school magazine, to give a bit of news to our readers. Little change has taken place in the school itself but an astounding transformation has befallen its surrounding. In the vast and fast developing Ipoh Garden Estate, houses have sprung up like mushrooms all around our school. The development is still going on and in time to come people who seldom have the opportunity of coming in this direction, will experience great difficulty in recognizing its environment. One has to see the change for oneself before one can believe it. However, we are proud to state that the school stands on a piece of ground higher than the rest.

Although the scholastic year has not been extraordinarily exciting and eventful, certainly it has been a successful one. If success is a relative factor, then it will be improper to evaluate it just by examination results. The efforts have been great, on the part of both teachers as well as pupils. The efforts of the teachers have been rewarded by the good response of their pupils not only in the playing field but in the classroom as well.

Enrolment: The school re-opened on 5th January, 1970 with a slightly increased enrolment of 506 boys, placed in both morning and afternoon sessions. This will be the pattern until we are in a position financially to erect more classrooms.

Staffing: There was a little change in the staff. Miss Rosa Leong was the only unfamiliar face at the beginning. She replaced Mr. Patrick Lee who had to attend a 3-month intensive course in Bahasa Malaysia for teachers in Kuala Lumpur. We regretted to lose the good services of Che Hafsa in May. There was a mutual transfer and we were happy to welcome Che Norlia as a new colleague of our staff.

Academic: True, our Std. 5 boys have to face a public examination towards the end of the year, we are working in the right direction by avoiding "cramming" just for this examination. We have good reasons to be satisfied

with the Std. 5 Examination results in 1969, depicted as follows:

Our Relay Team took the runners-up place at the S.M.I. (1) school annual sports.


We secured a second position at the Combined Schools Meet in the 4 x 100 meters relay for Division A.


Looking Ahead: This is important. We

St. Michael's Kindergarten

A Short History:

THE St. Michael's Kindergarten was started in March 1955 during the directorship of Rev. Bro. Denis, under the management of Mr. Tan Boon Kwee and two teachers—Miss Yeap Chai Choo and Miss Angela Yan. From an enrolment of 80 pupils, the number has increased steadily until we have now seventeen years later, a yearly intake of about 250 pupils.

The present manager is Mr. Lim Guan Choe who works in conjunction with Rev. Bro. Ultan Paul, Director of St. Michael's Institution, assisted by seven lady teachers.

Registration for Kindergarten and Std. 1 Classes:

Registration of pupils starts from March for the following year's pupils. Parents or Guardians of pupils are requested to register their children with Mr. Lim Guan Choe, Headmaster of Pr Sch. I, St Michael's Institution.

Acceptance of pupils in the Kindergarten does not necessarily mean that pupils will be automatically admitted to the S.M.I. Primary Schools. Parents will be informed in advance by letter to register their children for the Standard I classes for the following year in the schools of their choice.

An End-of-the-Year Party will be held before classes are dismissed for the Final Term Holidays.


Curriculum:


