The committee has helped in obtaining free spectacles for needy pupils from the President, Lions Club, Ipoh.









PRIMARY SCHOOL 2

SCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT 1974

The process of conversion of English Medium Schools to National Schools using Bahasa Malaysia as the medium of instruction is well advanced, this being the fifth year of its implementation so that by the end of next year, the operation will have been completed. We are happy to report that the plan is being successfully implemented here. The initial difficulties are gradually being surmounted, the teachers have gained confidence and the children have therefore benefited. However, the change to the new system of spelling has brought in its wake some measure of confusion and it took some time before the children could get used to it. The Education Authorities have given time for the gradual changeover but we have switched over to the new system pretty rapidly and this has been made possible by the publishers of textbooks having adopted it early.

There is a noticeable improvement in the oral use of Bahasa Malaysia among the children, but it is not spoken as frequently as desired outside the classroom and so this is an area that should be looked into in future.

SCHOOL ENROLMENT

The school has been found to be too large and at one stage, the enrolment reached 1,500. With our three Primary Schools sending up something like 550 boys to Form I, our Secondary School found it very difficult to cope with such large numbers — 13 to 14 Form I classes. The intake of Std. I pupils was therefore cut down from 250 to 200 pupils yearly so that there is a consequent decrease of 1 class or 50 boys a year. This year we have 4 classes in each Standard in the Lower Primary and 5 classes each in the Upper Primary with a total enrolment of 1282. The reduced intake of Std. I boys has disappointed a good number of parents. The number of boys registered for Standard I yearly averages between 400 and 500 and since only 200 can be absorbed, about 300 boys have to be turned away to find room in other schools.

The number of bumiputra boys has increased and the enrolment reflects a well-proportioned composition racially. There are no overaged boys in the school.



SCHOOL PREFECTS

THE TEACHING STAFF

The Teaching Staff is at full strength. We have 32 teachers, 12 men and 20 ladies. There were 3 changes during the year: Messrs. Chua Kok Thye, David Loh and Tang Sung Chiew were transferred away at the beginning of the year while Miss Anita Chan, after being married, resigned from her post. They were replaced by Cik Nolan bt. Md. Salleh, Encik Arbaai b. Md. Khalid. In June, Mr. Loke Kok Kin was transferred to Malim Nawar but because there was no trained teacher available to replace him, a temporary teacher, Cik Normadiah, was appointed to fill the vacancy.

THE CURRICULUM

There has been no major change in the curriculum. The teaching of Physical Education has been streamlined, two P.E. Teachers having been appointed to teach the subject. Bahasa Malaysia and English are given prominence and this is reflected in the allotment of over 300 minutes of teaching time per week. Chinese continues to be taught to pupils of Std. 3 to 6. There is a sprinkling of non - Chinese boys studying the subject. Non - bumiputra boys are progressing well in writing the Jawi Script although this is not compulsory to them. Malay boys are learning the subject under their Guru Ugama, while non-Malay pupils are taught by their own class teachers.

EXAMINATIONS

There has been no change in our system of holding two main examinations a year, namely the midyear and the final exams. and in between 2 other exams. of lesser importance. All these are internal exams. while Std. 3 and Std. 5 pupils sit for their respective assessment examinations conducted by the Ministry of Education. The results of the Std. 3 Government Exam. of last year were made known at the beginning of the second school term this year. The test was in 3 subjects namely Bahasa Malaysia, English and Mathematics. Our boys have done very well on the whole and the Teachers are to be congratulated on the fine results.

Our Std. 5 boys sat for their Govt. Assessment Exam. on 9th and 10th Sept. but the results will be known only in the following year. We can thus show only the 1973 results here which are reproduced in the tables below.

The analysis shows that the best subject is Ilmu Hisab (Maths) which has 83.6% passes with 70 boys out of 244 obtaining distinctions. The overall percentage of passes is 77.86 and it is Tawarikh & Ilmu Alam with 71.72% passes that has prevented the overall percentage from going higher. Both Bahasa Malaysia and English have very satisfactory results.



These two Packs have a strength of 46. They have their weekly meetings on Saturdays which last an hour. They took part in almost all the activities organized by the District Scout Commissioner such as Camping, inter-Cub games. They took part also in excursions.

UNIVERSAL CHILDREN'S DAY

This occasion was observed on 25th October. It was a red letter day for all the children and was celebrated with the joy befitting the occasion. The day began with a school assembly at which the Headmaster gave a talk on the significance and theme of the celebration. This was followed by a variety show given by representatives of all classes. A programme of over 25 items was completed without a hitch. At recess time, the children went to their classes to partake of the many items of cakes and icecream which had been brought to school by pupils who could afford in order to share with those who could not bring anything. Needless to say a good time was had by all.

MALAY LANGUAGE SOCIETY

This Society under the capable guidance of Encik Mujtabar and Puan Chan has done much to foster and encourage the study of the language. Fortnightly meetings on Saturdays were held. A full report of the Society is given elsewhere in these pages.

ANNUAL PRIZE GIVING

November 12th was prize-giving day. The occasion was held in the quadrangle of the school. A total of 115 recipients stepped out to receive book prizes from the Headmaster after a detailed report of the year's activities was read out.

THE HEALTH OF THE PUPILS

The satisfactory attendance at school of our pupils is an indication of the state of their health. There has been no mass outbreak of any serious disease among the children. In May this year a few cases of mumps occurred but this did not spread much.

During the year, Std. I boys were given B.C.G. for T.B. prevention. In addition the School Health Nurse visited the school on 27th September and 5th November to give Std. I boys a physical examination, revaccination against small-pox and immunization against polio and tetanus.

PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION

The first Parent-Teacher Association of the school was formed at a meeting of Parents and Teachers on 3.4.74. A sizeable crowd was present and after a speech of welcome, the Headmaster presided to elect a President, Vice-President, an Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer and a Committee of 9 as provided for under the Constitution. The following were elected to serve:-



LA SALLE SCHOOL

We began the 'Year of the Tiger' by recalling and stressing the School Motto 'Strive and Persevere' at our very first assembly. For us the secret of success lies in the policy 'Never let up, never let down'. This will be our guiding principle, not only for the current year, but for all the years to come. As we look over the accomplishments and successes of the year that is gone beyond recall, we cannot but feel a sense of deep gratitude to the Lord for the joys which accrued from our achievements in the field no less than in the academic sphere. Our thanks are also due to parents and teachers who collaborated so well to ensure the progress and advancement of the school.

ENROLMENT

For years past this has been quite constant. This year, however, we were given an extra Std I, 34 children of the Sarawak Army personnel (Land Dyaks) and with this intake our numbers swelled to 534, an increase of 42. One unique feature of the school is its seven pairs of twins. Three of these pose quite a problem of identity to their teachers who have taxed their ingenuity to discover ways and means (like birth marks or other like peculiarities) to obviate a repetition of Shakespeare's Comedy of Errors. One teacher had a brain-wave and called his Chinese twins Ali and Abu. After three years they are so used to the change they invariably answer to Ali and Abu!

The teaching staff too has registered an increase: Mr Tan Seng Chiew from St Michael's Primary, Puan Puteri Mazerah from Kampar, Mrs S. Sivakumaran from the T.A. Convent and Mrs Leong Bin Hean from the Raja Perempuan Primary, Ipoh. The members of the Staff are not only qualified and experienced, but what is more, they are all men and women of dedication who realise that the children are not objects to be moulded but people to be unfolded and developed, and therefore that they are unique persons with varying needs of their own.

STUDIES AND ASSESSMENTS

How often soever our ears are dinned with the cry 'Out with Exams' we believe that nothing can substitute for the incentive to excel that is provided by exams, wisely organised. Besides our three term exams every year, we have monthly tests on the important subjects of the curriculum. The results of the Stds 3 and 5 exams. are very satisfactory, as is evidenced in the following tables.

After the 1st Term Exam, parents were requested to collect their children's Report Cards from the teachers. They were thus given the opportunity to discuss with the teachers any problems in connection with the progress of their children. At 4.30 p.m. that day parents held a dialogue with the teachers on various topics related to the training and education of the children.

The rapid expansion of education has emphasised the need for more trained teachers and the D.T.C. in Tiger Lane has resumed its training programme. Ten teacher trainees were assigned to La Salle for a six-week spell of teaching practice. We were happy to have had them because they not only did their work well but easily mixed with our staff to everybody's satisfaction. During their period of teaching we had a series of games like Football, Badminton and Ping Pong. They had the advantage in zest and energy but we had the better of them in experience and won three of the four series in these friendly competitions.
